Washington (CNN) -- We've learned that one of President Obama's key problems with Republicans on the budget is that they simply don't like his ideas. Why else do the House of Representatives and Senate have such different plans for the budget? It's not simply that the House wants to cut spending; House Speaker Nancy Pelosi has made it plain that the main item of concern is the "sequester" spending cuts. And conservatives have made it clear: The House plan is unacceptable. The Senate, though, has a way out.
